Our church is going to set up a Blessing Box (little pantry) outside our church. We pray that it will become a true community effort. We will fill it with non-perishable food and items not supplied by SNAP (food stamps). So start saving and using those coupons from the Sunday paper to get extra toothpaste, deodorant, shampoo, soap, feminine products, laundry/dish detergent, toilet paper and paper towels.

Any non-perishable food items are welcome, but let's think about meals. Such as, cereal, pan-

cake mix and syrup, peanut butter and jelly, canned meats (tuna/chicken), canned meals (Spaghetti Os, etc.), boxed mac and cheese, pasta and sauces, rice, ramen, soup, boxed potatoes, canned veggies, fruit, and beans. All items can be placed in the container by the side door.

Bring what you can
Above all be Blessed

A beautiful scarf, passed down through the generations, connects two women who learn that the weight of the world is made bearable by the love we give away....

September 1911. On Ellis Island in New York Harbor, nurse Clara Wood cannot face returning to Manhattan, where the man she loved fell to his death in the Triangle Shirtwaist Fire.

Then, while caring for a fevered immigrant whose own loss mirrors hers, she becomes intrigued by a name embroidered onto the scarf he carries...and finds herself caught in a dilemma that compels her to confront the truth about the assumptions she's made. Will what she learns devastate her or free her?
