Pastor's Ponderings

What a beautiful spring! After taking my seven-year-old grandson to Washington DC for his spring break, which coincided with the scheduled blooming of the cherry blossom trees, I was acutely aware that God has the final say over nature. I saw beautiful cherry blossoms, but only after I returned to beautiful Hunterdon County. Spring was early in Washington DC. The blossoms had bloomed and fallen and blown away before we arrived. This was presumably news to the thousands of people who had similarly planned their vacation plans, especially because over a hundred cherry blossom trees, including the famous and beloved "Stumpy", are scheduled to be cut down this year. The reason for their demise is because the Tidal Basin is overflowing and is killing the trees bordering it. This is an increasingly non-debatable phenomenon of global warming.

Which brings me to *Stewardship*, which includes all that we do. What we do with the environment, our time, our relationships, our talents, our belongings, and our money. The first time I heard of Stewardship, I had no idea what they were talking about. I heard it in church and understood it to mean money. While money is the bottom line of a church survival, it is not the only way God asks us to give. Some have fallen upon financial hardship, especially retirees whose pensions and Social Security fall short of inflation. Some have had the blessing of abundance in finances. Most fall somewhere in between. All have been given a gift to contribute, in God's appointed way, to move this church forward into a thriving future.

The Session of KMPC has given the green light to forming a Stewardship Committee, which will focus on the money aspect of the church staying open. Don Reilly has heard the Call and Session approval to be the Chairman of the Committee. We are still figuring out the details of that role, but it is crucial. Right now, it involves money. The church building, and the manse, are a financial drain. The church is a historic building and beautiful and has a powerful history of members and clergy, but requires a lot of upkeep, and trained professionals to make repairs and keep the building from the dangers of disrepair. The Buildings and Grounds committee is working overtime to have the boiler and front doors replaced. The Food Pantry workers are working daily to gather and replace food for needed distribution to feed the hungry.

So, I ask, where is God calling you? What gifts do you have to offer back to God that God has so generously given to you. Pray about

it. And listen. Then give accordingly. Many thanks to those who have already given your diverse gifts to the church.

2024 KMPC Capital Fund Campaign

In the first quarter of this year, the church incurred two extraordinary expenses that depleted our Capital Fund by over \$26,000:

*January: One of the two boilers of the church needed to be replaced at a cost of \$13,600.

*March: It was discovered that there had been a water leak from the stained glass window above the front church doors which caused extensive water damage to the doors and damage to the interior wall of the vestibule. Repairs of the doors, window and wall resulted in a \$12,500 expense.



In collaboration with the Session of Kirkpatrick Memorial Presbyterian Church (KMPC), the Community Foundation of New Jersey is pleased to announce the Samuel Ayres, Jr. Scholarship for the academic year 2024-2025. Mr. Ayres, a former member of the KMPC congregation, established this scholarship to provide financial assistance to college-bound high school seniors, current college students, or anyone accepted into a master's degree program.

Preference is given to active KMPC members; however, in years when there is an insufficient number of applicants from within KMPC, the scholarship offering may be extended to members of other Presbyterian churches located in Hunterdon and Somerset Counties with a preference given to students pursuing a major in education (teaching profession). Annual scholarships of varying amounts may be awarded based on the availability of funds in any given year and the recipient's ability to demonstrate unmet financial need. The award is for one year and will be paid directly to the college. Applicants must reapply each year.

We ask that you share this opportunity with your church membership. The online application will open on April 15th, and the application can be found at https://www.grantinterface.com/sl/ip7rUo. The deadline for submission is July 1, 2024. Please note only fully completed applications will be accepted for award consideration; late applications will not be accepted. Award announcements will be made in mid-August.


