Pastor's Ponderings

We are entering the Season of Christmas and will soon celebrate the time in which God came to earth as Jesus Christ. Our Emmanuel (translated as God with us) has come to dwell among us.

Christmas lights break through the deep darkness on homes, streets, and through towns. The stores have begun (or have already finished) hanging up the decorations. All the adornments are meant to bring us great joy. Children's eyes sparkle with excitement in eager anticipation for the surprises that will come. The adults have a tense look in their eyes as they are making mental lists to get it all accomplished.

It was a custom throughout early America that the Christmas story was read from the Gospel of Luke and Matthew. The fireplace would be sending off warmth to those who were gathered around. The Bible would be opened by an adult in a chair, and children and adults would be as captivated as the reader, who with joy, would dramatically read the story from the family Bible.

Yet, it seems we do not make the time to turn to that tradition now. We are busy preparing meals, setting the table, wrapping last minute gifts, driving relatives to our homes, and try to accomplish much more than is reasonable. It is the "modern" world, and we must keep up with the times. Our focus is on one that is on our list in the shortest amount of time so we can get to the next thing on our list.

But this is also a time for rest. We are given this time to slow down and remember that Jesus is the reason for the season. The best gifts, the best meals, the best decorations cannot come close to the Gift given to us by God. The Christmas story in the Bible might be the best centerpiece in our lives as we celebrate.

As N.T. Wright says, if you removed the Christmas stories from the Bible (and I am not suggesting we do,) you would lose one chapter in Matthew and two in Luke. Advent is a time of waiting, with our purple (for repentance) or blue (anticipation) liturgical colors on full display, we know that as the colors suggest, we are somewhere in between darkness and light. While we wait for the spontaneous inbreaking of grace into the world through Jesus, we should not be afraid to take time to remember what we have been given. We can focus on the fact that the grace experienced in the birth, life, ministry, words, death, and resurrection is always reflected in the church. This is not simply when it celebrates the miracle of Christmas, but when it experiences God's justice and mercy.

That justice, brought to us in Jesus, is what we seek and is what begins at Christmas, as we celebrate the inbreaking of God's kingdom to the world. This happens in small ways as well as large. It happens in the building of relationships, the integration of grief into our lives, the budding signs of hope in a broken world, giving a gift. The small, local

experiences are just as capable of telling the world about our Savior as any wide scale commercial productions, or smaller programs can do.

Eventually, the peace that passes all our understanding, reigns in realms we cannot begin to understand. And rests in our heart.

Slow down and remember the Biblical instruction to

"Be still and know that I am God." (Psalm 46:10)

A Christmas birth leads us to Bethlehem, it leads to a cross, and an empty grave. It leads us to one another and new ways of living in grace, peace, and love. Have a wonderful Advent season! Have a merry Christmas, and do not forget what Jesus came to do, remember that Jesus came for you! Rejoice!!!


